

IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

WARNING: When using electrical products, basic cautions should always be followed, including the following:

5. Do not use this apparatus near water.
6. Clean only with a dry cloth.
7. Do not block any of the ventilation openings. Install in accordance with manufacturer's instructions.
8. Do not install near any heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves or other apparatus (including amplifiers)
9. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized or grounding-type plug. A polarized plug has two blades with one wider than the other. A grounding type plug has two blades and a third grounding plug. The wide blade or third prong is provided for your safety. If the provided plug does not fit into your outlet, consult an electrician for replacement of the obsolete outlet.
10. Protect the power cord from being walked on or pinched, particularly at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point they exit from the apparatus.
11. Note for UK only: If the colors of the wires in the mains lead of this unit do not correspond with the terminals in your plug, Proceed as follows:
 - a) The wire that is colored green and yellow must be connected to the terminal that is marked by the letter E, The earth symbol, colored green or colored green and yellow.
 - b) The wire that is colored blue must be connected to the terminal that is marked with the letter N or the color black.
 - c) The wire that is colored brown must be connected to the terminal that is marked with the letter L or the color red.
12. Only use attachments/accessories provided by the manufacturer.
13. Use only with a cart, stand, tripod, bracket, or table specified by the manufacturer, or sold with the apparatus. When a cart is used, use Caution When moving the cart/apparatus combination to avoid injury from tip-over
14. Unplug this apparatus during lightning storms or when unused for long periods of time.
15. Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel. Servicing is required when the apparatus has been damaged in any way, such as power-supply cord or plug is damaged, liquid has been spilled or objects have fallen into the apparatus, the apparatus has been exposed to rain or Moisture, does not operate normally, or has been dropped.

If exposure exceeds the limits set forth above. To ensure against potentially dangerous exposure to high sound pressure levels it is recommended that all persons exposed to equipment capable of producing high sound pressure levels such as this amplification system be protected by hearing protectors while this unit is in operation.

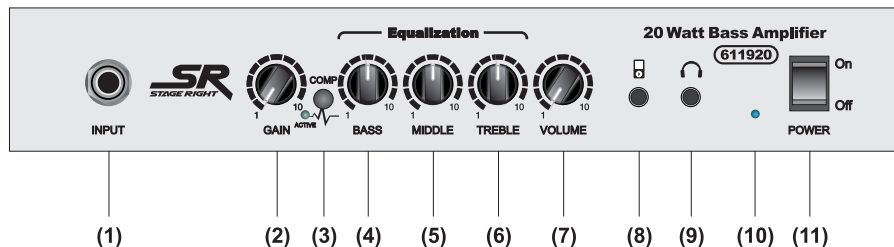

FRONT PANEL

(1) INPUT : This is an instrument level 1/4" TS input. You can plug in virtually any musical instrument or line-level audio source, such as a guitar (bass or lead), keyboard, drum machine, mixer, cassette deck, CD player, or any other pre-amplified, non-microphone signal. If you notice any unwanted distortion in this case, turn down the volume control on the device.

(2) GAIN: This control is used to set the level of gain in the pre-amp section. At higher level, the signal will clip and creates distortion. The Gain knob should be used together with the Volume control to achieve desired result.

(3) COMP: This turns on/off the on-board compressor. It compresses the input-signal and giving it a punchier sound. The amount of compression is controlled by the Gain knob. The Clip LED indicates when compressor is active.

(4) BASS: Equalization control that adjusts the amount of boost or cut in the low frequency range.

(5) MIDDLE: Equalization control that adjusts the amount of boost or cut in the low middle frequency range

(6) TREBLE: Equalization control that adjusts the amount of boost or cut in the high frequency range.

(7) VOLUME : Sets how loud the amplifier gets.

(8) AUX: For connecting any external sound device, such as CD or mp3 player.

(9) HEADPHONES: This is a 3.5mm stereo headphone jack for plugging in headphones. The internal speaker is disconnected whenever a cable is plugged into the headphone jack.

(10) POWER LED: Indicates whether the unit is on or off.

(11) POWER: This ON/OFF switch controls power to the unit.
